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Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is lots of fun! Children enjoy getting dressed up and trick or treating. Parents should use the following tips to keep Halloween safe:

- 1. Choose a light-colored costume because these are easily seen at night.
- 2. Add reflective tape or glow in the dark tape to the front and back of the costume and the trick-ortreat bag.
- 3. Only buy costumes that are labeled "flamed-retardant". This means that the material won't burn.
- 4. Make sure wigs and beards don't cover the children's faces.
- 5. If using costume make-up, test the make up on your child's arm first to make sure they are not allergic.
- 6. Avoid oversized and high-heeled shoes as well as large costumes that can cause children to trip and fall.
- 7. Make sure that any props your children carry, such as wands or swords are short and flexible. Do not bring swords or toy firearms to school.
- 8. Limit trick-or-treating to your neighborhood and the homes of people you and your children know.
- 9. When the children get home, check all treats and make sure they are sealed. Throw out candy with torn packages or holes in the packages, spoiled items, and any homemade treats that haven't been made by someone you know.
- 10. Don't allow children to have hard candy or gum that could cause choking.
